



Your Nevada Driver's License or Identification Card

Proof of Identity

You must be a Nevada resident and provide a Nevada street address to obtain a driver's license, instruction permit or ID card. You must surrender any existing out-of-state license or ID and provide proof of your name and date of birth. You must provide proof of your Social Security number if one has been assigned to you.

Proof of Name/Date of Birth

- Certified U.S. Issued Birth Certificate or Certified Abstract (hospital copies are not accepted)
- U.S. Passport
- U.S. Military Identification or DD-214 Military Report of Separation
- Certificate of Citizenship or Naturalization
- Certificate of Degree of Indian Blood
- Consular Report of Birth Abroad
- Permanent or Temporary Resident Card
- Resident Alien Card or I-551 Receipt
- Valid Foreign Passport "Processed for I-551"
- I-94 Arrival-Departure Record with Visa or Passport
- Permit to Reenter the U.S.
- Refugee Travel Documents

Proof of Social Security Number

- State License or ID with number listed
- Social Security Card
- U.S. Military Identification
- Original DD-214 Military Separation Form
- Social Security Benefits Documentation

Maiden Names/Name Changes

You must present documentation of any name change if you will be presenting a proof of identity document that does not contain your current legal name. For example, if your birth certificate lists your maiden name, you must also present a Marriage Certificate.

All documents must be originals. We do not accept photocopies.

Driving Privileges

If your driving privileges are revoked or suspended in another state, you must meet the reinstatement requirements and be "cleared" in that state. If you have outstanding citations or warrants for traffic-related offenses, these also must be cleared in order to receive a driver's license.

All applicants take a vision test. You will have to take written and driving skills tests if your last license has been expired, revoked, etc. for more than one year or if you have never been licensed in the U.S.

Duplicate Nevada License or ID and Homeless Fee Exemption

You must provide the Proof of Identity documents listed above to receive a duplicate Nevada license or ID card.

If you have been issued a Nevada license or ID in the past, you may qualify for a one-time fee exemption for a *duplicate* only. The fee exemption does not apply to renewals, commercial licenses or any fees relating to a suspension or revocation.
